1098 Mar. Foundation of libraries.

1099 - St Robert recalled to Molome by Urban - see Exordium cap. 6.

1111 - Death of St Robert. - April 17 -

succeeded by Guy le Chaste Canon 1111 - 1132 - friend of St Bernard.

Then. Géraud 1140 - 1148 - again good relations with St B.  
etc. Thuribellus to Miller.

1198. Molome definitely decadent - Abbot of Cluny appointed to make Reg. visitations -  
But - an immediate arrival under Gauderic  
Eudes II - 1215 - 1227 - works for canonization of St Robert, in communion with Cluny.

(Dec. 1222.)

1245 - The First Mart. of Cist. + founder of Cist. Order see by Gen. Chapter.

## Formation of Curia.

- 1) Exordium Parvum. - brief, official definition of an ideal. - but early.
- 2). Exord. Magnum - rel. late. - fanciful.
- 3) Wm of Malmesbury. - *Historia Regum Anglorum* - biased. by Stephen.
- 4) Ordericus Vitalis - imaginative.
- 5) Vita Roberti - 13<sup>th</sup> cent. - does not correspond with others.  
says Alberic & Stephen went to the hermit of Vincent.  
them went to St. Jean & were found there by Robert + 22.

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## Evolution of Curia Constitution

Ante - based on Ex Parvum. - Lekai.

- 1) 1098. - Jan? - Robert with Alberic, Stephen - old, detailed, John + Peter.  
sent to P. legate asking permission to make a new form "without his protection".  
the approval.

Letter of Hugh. Lekai f. 252. (Read)

21 March - 1098 - date of  
can. election of mon.

Encourages + helps project to do otherwise + keep Rule of H.B. more  
perfectly.

- 2). 1100. April 18. - Papal U grants the Privilegium Romano.  
purpose - to ensure peace for the Cistercian reform.

Prop. a) John + Alberic sent to Rome. EP. (Lekai) f. 258.

b) with letters of Two Cardinals - John + Benedict. f. 258.  
ask that previous protection granted by Urban. (254, 255?) be  
confirmed.

Letter of legate, Hugh - defining boundaries + preserving by Benedictines  
during protection.

Letter of Wulfstan of York - every thing is in order - all has been  
settled with us. to orders of Urban II -  
~~for~~ protection supported. - under bishop. 260 - 261.

Formation of Citeaux. - From based on Charters etc. Fishé.

- 1- That the place was wild + desolate - something of a wilderness.  
Then were 2 families of hermits in the neighborhood.  
Possibly a chapel.  
They + land they were on  
given to Citeaux last 1134.  
1143  
(Fisher)
- 2- That they got there on Mar 21 - oversimplified. Mar 21. the official date ("commonly cited?")  
The months before to run the chapel for Mass. - It is (it) dedicated in 1098, however no tall.  
- no chapel or now?
3. Support of Lyone Brey, a jealous reformed + friend of Robert.  
Support of Odo (Gros) Duke of Burgundy - who brought more land + added to  
property. Helped months finish wooden buildings. - months drawn from feudal obligations  
& parts in (his) woods.
4. Robert installed at Châlons.  
months ~~were~~ make stability at Citeaux.
5. Xmas 1098. Odo presents Robert with a vineyard, in presence of great multitude of lords  
commoner Fisher p. 55 - silly remark! They were there!
