IN LANGUAGE OF THE SELF, the fourth of Mon. Schuon's books to appear in English, and the first to be published in India, we find a clear and penetrating light on many aspects of spirituality in different traditions. His books which unfold spiritual treasures at every fresh encounter are already coming to be recognised as of unique importance in the West. Mon. Schuon is not a mere *pundit*—his influence as a leaven of spirituality in Europe and his explications on the importance of doctrine, ritual, *japa*, and spiritual virtues, indeed of all 'forms' includable in tradition, make his function akin to that of the great *ācāryas* of Hinduism. There is no 'confusion of levels' in his writings, every issue under consideration is properly related to its metaphysical principle.

Even the most complacent reader will be drawn to re-examine his own convictions in the light of the transcendent wisdom enshrined in Tradition, for, as the author has shown, it is only within the framework of traditional orthodoxy that it is possible to see one's standing in the light of Truth.
